WHY NETWORKING MATTERS IN STEM

- Opens doors to job opportunities, mentorship, and collaborations
- Essential for staying current in a rapidly evolving field
- Builds a support network for advice, feedback, and encouragement



STATISTICS ON NETWORKING BENEFITS

- Professionals with strong networks more likely to advance
- Networking can increase job satisfaction and confidence



GETTING STARTED WITH NETWORKING

- Start with colleagues, former classmates, professors
- Set networking goals: building relationships, finding mentors
- Practice elevator pitch: concise summary of who you are and goals



ONLINE NETWORKING STRATEGIES

- Use LinkedIn to connect with professionals and join relevant groups
- Engage by sharing posts, commenting, showcasing projects
- Attend virtual events and webinars to meet global professionals



OFFLINE NETWORKING TIPS

- Attend STEM-specific conferences, workshops, meetups
- Practice active listening, show genuine interest in others
- Follow up with a personalized message to keep connections active



BALANCING ONLINE AND OFFLINE NETWORKING

- Combine strategies for a well-rounded network
- Use online platforms to maintain offline connections
- Develop consistency in attending events and engaging online



BUILDING STRONG RELATIONSHIPS

- Start with respect and professional curiosity
- Offer value by sharing insights or introductions
- Focus on long-term connections over short-term benefits



MAINTAINING YOUR NETWORK

- Regularly check in with messages or invites
- Share relevant articles or updates
- Acknowledge achievements and support others' goals



EXPANDING BEYOND IMMEDIATE CONNECTIONS

- Ask current contacts for introductions
- Join industry groups and associations
- Be open to unexpected connections for new perspectives



INTRODUCTION TO SPEED NETWORKING

- Goal: Practice networking by meeting many people in a structured format
- Introduce yourself, share a key goal or project in 2 minutes each



SPEED NETWORKING TIPS AND REFLECTION

- Be concise, highlight one unique aspect
- Listen attentively, take notes
- Reflect on who you'd like to reconnect with and why

THE LONG-TERM IMPACT OF NETWORKING

- Networking builds a lifelong support system
- Provides a resource pool for knowledge, advice, and encouragement
- Collaboration in STEM is often driven by strong relationships



NETWORKING SUCCESS STORIES

- Share an example of a professional who advanced due to networking
- How relationships helped with collaborations or job offers
- Importance of persistence and follow-through



NETWORKING DO'S AND DON'TS

- Do: Be genuine, listen actively, offer value
- Don't: Focus only on benefits to you, avoid oversharing
- Keep interactions professional, follow up



CULTIVATING A SUPPORTIVE PROFESSIONAL COMMUNITY

- Engage in mutual learning by sharing experiences
- Seek mentorship opportunities and offer guidance to others
- A supportive network is reciprocal; contribute as much as you receive



OVERCOMING NETWORKING CHALLENGES

- Tips for introverts: Prepare in advance, take breaks if needed
- Managing time at events: Set a goal for the number of connections
- Follow-ups: Use reminders to stay in touch with key contacts



EVALUATING YOUR NETWORKING PROGRESS

- Reflect on recent connections and their impact on goals
- Assess areas to improve, like engagement frequency
- Set goals to expand or deepen your network this year



FINAL REFLECTION ON NETWORKING GROWTH

- Reflect on networking's impact on career or personal growth
- Set an intention to meet one new person each month
- Be proactive and authentic in all networking efforts
